City to seek photo radar to reduce highway noise in 'short term'

City council adopted a resolution March 7 asking Transport Quebec to install photo radar on Highway 136/720 on the stretch between Atwater and Hallowell.

This is a 70 km/h speed limit zone where cars go so fast at night that it sounds like drag racing, Councillor Kathleen Kez told the *Independent*. She said she test-drove it herself, was unable to go at the

speed limit and had to go with the flow of traffic – at 110 km/h.

The resolution asks for the photo radar "to reduce roadway noise." This, according to Kez, is at least in the short term until the city's request for a sound barrier can be resolved after the current feasibility study (see story, July 13, 2021, p. 5). "Of course, we want the sound barrier," she added.

mal application form regarding requests for photo radar. "It's something I've been pushing for since before the [November 2021 municipal] election." She said that city director general Hadi Hakim had looked into the matter and found there is an established protocol for such a request. "It sounds like an easy fix for the noise."
